Dear Parent,

We are glad you have chosen to allow your player to participate in our 2011-2012 Season try-outs for Futura Southland. This year, try-outs for us are a bit more challenging than the norm, but exciting as well--as try-outs in Kansas City overlap with State Cup in St. Louis. Of all the soccer in the KC area, there are approximately 20 teams from the Kansas City area playing at the Cup level in St. Louis and 12 of those teams this year are Futura teams—Wow! State Cup is the highest level tournament hosted in our state, and we are excited to have so many of our athletes and their teams representing the club there. This unfortunate timing issue does present some challenges as many of our coaches are juggling a lot during this time with being out of town for some of the first try-out sessions, but we feel having these teams and coaches represent the club is a significant part of why we do what we do and of our worthy players/team development. We are proud of their hard work to build up to being able to compete at this level.

We would like to introduce you briefly to the history of our club. Long-time soccer player & coach, as well as my college roommate, Todd Logan, of Liberty, Missouri, founded the Futura Futbol Club in 1992. Logan saw the need for soccer instruction focused on individual technical development, teamwork, and a commitment to excellence. He founded the club in the Kansas City Northland area with 1 team, and the club has grown to service approximately 900 players in the KC Metro area through teams, junior academies, and camps.

In 2005, Futura developed some teams in the Lee's Summit area, and at that time I came to the club to coach a u11 boys team, Futura Juventus. Since that team formed in the fall of 2005, our Southland-based teams have grown to approximately 28 teams and the coaching staff has grown significantly as well over the past 5 years. Our growth has in some cases been accidental, but our burden to provide quality leadership to our soccer community and their families, kept us looking to be discerning in our managing staying the course in balancing quantity and quality. We have not set a goal to have a certain number of teams in a certain time span, but we have seen growth as our players have developed, teams have strengthened, and many quality families have come along side us in our cause.

Our coaching staff seeks to promote excellence through soccer, not just in how the game is played, but in how we compete passionately, respond respectfully, and develop completely the players that we have the privilege to work with. Our coaching staff believes that coaching is more than just coaching the game of soccer. We know all too well that the athleticism is “but for a season” but those traits that can be acquired will extend beyond the pitch. Our desire, as one of your child’s coaches, is to do the best we can. We strive to impact them in a positive way while building quality athletes that through the tool of athletics are prepared to be successful in every other aspect of their future responsibilities of life.

We think you will find that our tight group/fellowship of quality coaches that have worked together from the college level to the real little guys, help each other as we are striving to master the craft of coaching. We are very blessed to have such quality coaches and trainers to invest into our young people. Our friendship, trust & unified philosophy/focus of cause has made us, as we say in working with our teams “stronger together.” With that being said, the behind the scenes people are huge in their servant style leadership as they are the glue and maybe the grease that holds things together and makes things smoother than the average! We would love to work with you and your athlete as a potential fit with our Futura family.

Our Club Philosophy



Club / Coach Commitment: When we ask a player to be a part of our club, we are committing to them to train them to take the next step in their soccer development: technically, tactically, and competitively. Our coaches commit to the individual development of the player as well as to team development. They strive to see each player and each team progress throughout the soccer year.

We are **committed** to using our best judgment in the decisions with the athletes to do what we feel is best for the athlete's development and their team's goals. We have learned that players develop at different rates and occasionally player placement could change during a soccer year. It is our desire to keep positive momentum for each player and team and occasionally roster adjustments are necessary during the year. Please realize that all good coaches have a vision for what they want to achieve, and our coaches will do their best to make good judgments, so these objectives can be accomplished. Mistakes can happen even by leadership, but you can be assured our mistakes are going to be "head" mistakes, not "heart" mistakes. Our heart's sincere desire is to be respectable, creditable, and overall, a positive influence in the lives of our athletes. In no way would we intentionally make mistakes that would stray from this ultimate objective. Whether the athlete matures into a world class soccer player or simply a great dad or mom that then materializes into a fantastic, balanced, knowledgeable coach, our objective is to use soccer as a tool to assist parents in carrying the athletes as far as they can go in soccer and instill successful life skill set principles that parallel beautifully with athletics.

Player Commitment: When a player and his/her family accept an invitation to be part of a Futura Futbol Club team, they are making a serious commitment to their team. Each team counts on all their players to practice and compete with enthusiasm; a player, who doesn't fulfill his/her commitment, lets down his/her team. If a player must miss a practice because of another commitment or an illness, he/she must notify the team manager or coach. If a player knows in advance that he/she cannot attend a tournament, he/she must notify the team manager or coach as soon as possible so that the team can find a substitute player if possible. Each team also requires a financial commitment to pay for training and tournaments. Families are expected to stay up-to-date on their payments. If a family cannot afford the team fees, they can discuss scholarship options with the team manager.

Communication is critical to any successful organization. Our desire, though probably not flawless, is to do very well in communication. Schedule changes, player progress and performance, tournaments, etc. are all going to try to be proactively communicated. As parents of the athletes, we want you to help in the communication process. We want you to feel free to ask questions and be approachable for feedback. If there are issues that you feel need to be discussed with coach(es), etc., then the best policy of communication is “1 v 1.” Just like a class act athlete, seek out that person with whom the issue is pertaining, and with class, talk through the issues.

Wins and losses are a measuring stick for determining progress, but that alone is a very shallow, short-term approach to tracking performance and progress. I feel that many times wins over losses are over-rated, especially at developmental ages. Winning is a beautiful, satisfying phenomena, and it is important to develop that tender balance of having an intense passion to win, laced with the smarts of a long-term mentality and sound, fundamental disciplines accompanied with the values of respect & sportsmanship. Similar to building a structure on a solid foundation versus an unstable foundation, the results of your work may take longer, but if it is built properly, it will last the test of time and will be stable in the time of storm. If you learn, train, and play the game right with the proper balances, the wins will take care of themselves. We want to keep the focus on winning, not just today (this season or tournament), but for the long haul. This is the “big picture.”

The structure of **authority** monitors direction, reduces chaos, and provides a platform for progress. Anytime there are multiple people seeking to co-exist, authority is necessary. When all parties fulfill their role with the right spirit and attitude, success can occur. Whether it is Mom & Dad, officer friendly, a teacher, coach, referee or umpire, we will always have to deal with imperfect authorities. The best thing we can do to teach our athletes respect is to exercise respect ourselves. Dad & Mom are the authority in the home; the boss is authority on the job; the coach is authority on the team; and the official calls the shots in the match. As parents, we need to be very cautious in undermining these authorities. Many times swallowing a little pride and maybe biting our tongues or taking one on the chin for the cause has long-term benefits. Utilize the “1 v.1 principle” to maintain the respect which coincides with sportsmanship and success in the game of life.

FFC-S General Information

- Our soccer season begins the week of August 1.
- The first week of August we will train each team 1x, and then begin our 2x a week trainings the second week of August.
- 2x / week training runs through the end of October. Training times do shorten as we lose daylight in October.
- We move to indoor training November 1 with training times 1x weekly. Dates of training can change when we go indoors as we are subject to indoor times and availability for scheduling these sessions. We are currently looking at Sports City, Lakeland, and some schools in Blue Springs for our indoor locations.
- We typically train indoor through the middle of March, just after school spring breaks.
- We begin 2x / week outdoor training in mid-March and run through mid-May.
- Typically during the middle of May, we move back to 1 training session per week depending on the ending of league plays.

Who: All players and skill levels age u9 and up.

When: Tuesdays and Thursdays during the month of July (July 5, 7, 12, 14, 19, 21, 26, 28) rain, we will use Friday nights and/or Mondays for make-up dates.

Times: U9-U12 players from 5:45-7:15 pm / U13 and up players from 7-9 pm

What: FFC-S Melee will be a 3-fold program during the summer geared to keep players touching the ball, improving skills, developing stamina, and having fun while competing on an individual basis, age appropriate. Each night will consist of technical training (ball skills, shooting, receiving, dribbling, etc.), speed, agility, and quickness training, and then small-sided games with an emphasis on earning points individually in a competition that will go throughout the entire month of July. Points will be tracked individually with prizes for the winners in each age group being handed out at the end of each evening as well as accumulating through the month.

Benefits:

- Expose players to coaches who will bring a different look, flavor, and emphasis to each session. The speed and agility training will expose athletes to the proper techniques of athlete-building, explosive, body movements. Athletes will develop technique, quickness, and coordination from this training.
- The vision of technical training is to keep the ball at the player's feet and keep their touches fresh. Some athletes will take this and blossom to a whole new level and some will maintain. This development will likely be affected by how much the players continue to work on skills on their own between our sessions. This Hands-down, the most fun piece of the summer, the Melee program, will be the small-sided games. This part will be the Battle Zone: back yard / street soccer that has some structure and organization. We are striving to develop courageous, balanced, passionate, creative competitors, not just technical and tactical players. Players will play with new teams each week and earn individual points with prizes awarded at the end of each night and at the end of the month of July.
- This program is **open to players of all clubs**, so bring your friends, neighbors, and relatives, and have a fun month playing soccer, developing skills, and competing against each other.
- This summer Melee will provide a great off-season program of psychological rest but have hidden benefits in technical training, creative play, and competitive development.
- FUN, FUN, FUN—We anticipate players won't want to leave when the evening is done.

Financial Commitment Information
July 2011-June 2012**

Futura Futbol Club Fee:

An annual club fee of \$70.00 will be paid through GOT SOCCER at the time you accept an invitation to play with a Futura team. This is normally in July. The club fee is used to cover administrative costs such as maintaining the club website, club office and office staff, practice field insurance, advertising costs, etc.

Uniform Fee:

Futura Futbol Club will have a “club uniform” that has been approved by the Futura Futbol Club board. The “Official” club uniform will include a primary and a secondary jersey, shorts, warm-up suit and socks.

For teams playing U9 and older, the primary uniform will be an Adidas Regista in royal blue and Squadra II in white. The shorts will be the Equipo. The cost of the basic kit (2 jerseys, shorts, socks) is \$92.50.

For teams playing U8 and younger, teams may choose a Futura T-shirt jersey in any of the four primary colors provided by the Futura Club. Uniform fee for these teams is \$47.50 (2 t-shirts, shorts, socks).

The optional sweat suit is \$82.50. All uniforms must be purchased through the Futura Club and from an approved Futura vendor. No other uniform may be worn.

Session Fees:

Most of the Southland teams compete in the KC Metro league or Heartland Soccer League outdoor sessions in both the fall and spring. The fee for each of these sessions is \$82.50 for U8 and under and \$92.50 for all others. The fall registration will be paid through GOT SOCCER at the time you have accepted an invitation to play with a Futura Southland team. This is normally by July 1. The spring registration fee of \$92.50 will be paid through GOT SOCCER in January during Spring Registration.

Two indoor sessions are offered during the winter months. Indoor league location may vary by coach, age group, and competition. Teams may participate in either the Sports City League in Blue Springs, The Sports Lodge League in Independence, Soccer Dome in North Kansas City, a local Futsal league or other venues available in our area. The cost of each indoor session is \$115.00. This cost includes the league fee and the cost of an indoor practice facility. The Winter I fee is due by October 1. The Winter II fee is due by December 1. **The Futura Southland coaching staff strongly encourages each athlete to participate in at least the Winter II session.** Your commitment to play the indoor session is assumed unless notification is given to your team manager prior to the fee due date. If your athlete can not participate during one or both of the indoor sessions, please notify your team manager prior to the fee due date (i.e. Oct. 1 for Winter I and Dec. 1 for Winter II). Otherwise, fees will be assessed. Fee may be waived at the manager/coach’s discretion, upon extenuating circumstances. (High School Boys players’ will participate in one 10 - 12 week session costing \$205.)

Tournament Fees:

In addition to league games, the Futura Southland teams also participate in tournaments throughout the year. The number of tournaments will vary by team. The cost of each tournament is \$40 per player for U12 and under and \$45 for U13 and above. The coaching staff will determine the anticipated number of tournaments by team. This number will be multiplied by \$40/\$45 then pro-rated over that team’s soccer year. (E.g. If your coach plans to enter your athlete’s u 12 team into 4 tournaments during the year, \$15 will be collected monthly to cover

your tournament costs ($40 * 4 = 160$; $160/11 \approx \$15$). This pro-rated amount will be collected along with the coaching fee, the pro-rated practice field fee, , etc. (See more details on the monthly fee below.)

In the event that a team participates in a tournament that requires an over-night stay, each family is responsible for their personal travel expenses. The coaching staff will determine which teams may be traveling. Each player will contribute a determined amount for that team ranging from \$10 to \$50 per year to a tournament fund to reimburse coaching staff for fuel, lodging, etc. expenses that are accrued due to tournaments whether local or out of town. This fee is indicated on each team’s calculator fee sheet.

Coaching Fee:

In order to provide your athlete quality instruction, it is the policy of the Futura Futbol Club to pay the coaching staff a monthly salary. The charge for your coach will vary by age group according to the table below. A portion of the coaching fee is used for coaching education, licenses, etc. The coaching fee will be collected monthly along with the pro-rated practice field fee, and pro-rated tournament fee, etc. Academy teams may have a different coaching fee and this will be reflected on the team calculator. (See more details on the monthly fee below.)

Outdoor Practice Field Fee:

A \$50 annual fee for U14 and under players (\$25 for High School) will be used to pay for outdoor rental or maintenance of outdoor practice facilities. The practice field fee will be pro-rated over the soccer year, along with the pro-rated tournament fee , coaching fee, etc. (See more details on the monthly fee below.)

Monthly Fee:

As described above, a monthly fee consisting of the coaches’ fee, pro-rated tournament fee, pro-rated practice field fee, etc. will be assessed for 11 months (except U8 and H.S.). The first and last month’s fee is due at the time you accept the invitation to play with the Futura team. The monthly fee will be due on the first of each month thereafter. The total monthly fee will vary depending on age group and number of tournaments anticipated for your team. Please see the appropriate team calculator spreadsheet for details of your athlete’s team’s monthly fee.

Dual Card Players:

If your athlete’s primary team is *within* the Futura club, the following dual card fees will be assessed: \$55 fall and spring session fee paid through GOT SOCCER; a \$40 per session fee paid through FFC-S, and then a \$20 tournament fee

for any tournaments played also paid through FFC-S. If asked to dual card during a Winter session, only the additional tournament fee will be assessed.

If your athlete's primary team is **outside** the Futura club, the following dual card fees will be assessed: \$55 fall and spring session fees paid through GOT SOCCER, \$40 per session fee paid through FFC-S, and a \$20 tournament fee for any tournaments played. If playing indoor with the team, the Winter fee for that age group also applies.

Dual card fees will be assessed and charged per session, not per year.

Fee Adjustments: The following circumstances may warrant an adjustment to your Futura fees:

- A 5% discount off of the total yearly FFC-S cost will be given if paid in full by July 1.
- Futura families with three or more athletes will pay a total annual club fee of \$175.
- If your athlete is dual carded with another Futura team, the club fee will be assessed only once.
- The outdoor session registration fee for Futura families with two or more athletes will be reduced by \$10 a season (i.e. fall/spring) for the second and subsequent athletes.
- If your athlete cannot participate in a winter session, and your team manager was notified before the winter session due date, only the pro-rated tournament fee, and pro-rated practice field fee will be charged during the months in which your athlete is not participating. (e.g. If your athlete does not play Winter I, and your team will be participating in 4 tournaments during the year, your adjusted monthly fee for November and December will be \$20; (\$15+5).)
- In the event that your athlete is injured and is unable to participate in games or training sessions, the coaching fee will be waived starting with the first full month of the player's injury. The fee will be resumed once the player resumes participation in games or training.
- A \$15 service fee will be assessed for any check that is returned by the bank for insufficient funds.

Financial Commitment and Contact Information:

Each team requires a financial commitment to pay for league games, training, and tournaments. Families are expected to stay up-to-date on their payments. If a family cannot afford the team fees, they can discuss scholarship options with the team manager. Fundraising will also be available to offset costs. Volunteers are needed from each team to help coordinate fundraising activities. Please let your team manager know that you are interested in assisting with the planning of these events.

In the event that an athlete's account becomes behind, that athlete may not be allowed to play the next league session or tournament until the account becomes current. We define current as less than 2 months behind owed per player.
